This event celebrates the "Old School" style of pattern flying with one maneuver per pass and the majority of the models flown are designs from the 70's and the 80's. Since I started pattern flying in 1975 this is right up my alley. I really enjoy these classic models and the fast, open flying we used to do with them. I'm going to start working on holding a Classic Pattern event at our field later in the year, probably early November.

I competed in another pattern event at the Hemet Model Masters field on May 26th and 27th. The Greear's were out on a 4-wheel drive camping trip so they didn't make it but our new members Jamie Schoolcraft and his son Steven were there. The pattern bug has hit Jamie hard and he bought a 2-meter Evolution from Jean Greear and has been doing a bunch of practice flying. This effort came through as he won the Sportsman Class at this contest. Congratulations Jamie! I moved up from Masters to F3A this year and I was able to win the class at this meet. The move up for me has been a lot of work but it has been more fun for me testing myself at this level again.

Barkley's Safety Tip



Hey guys!

Those new 2.4 radios have been so nice that I see almost everyone has switched over to using this new equipment. But I also see that many still have their older 72 radios that they bring out every now and then. They still work fine so why not use them? But please remember to use the Frequency Paddles just north of the center pit area. You don't want to ruin your day or someone else's! Here's the Frequency Control rules from the Field Regulations,

1. Frequency control of radios other then 2.4 GHz Spread Spectrum equipment consists of the frequency paddle stand located near the center of the pit area. Prior to turning on such a transmitter, the owner must rotate up the paddle that corresponds to the frequency of their transmitter. The owner will then use a clothespin or other such device to pin the paddle in the up position. They will also place their AVTI membership card or a facsimile of such on the paddle. They are then clear to turn on the transmitter.

2. Flyers using the South Area will use the same frequency paddle stand if not using 2.4 GHz Spread Spectrum equipment.

3. Fliers using the Helicopter area will only use 2.4 GHz Spread Spectrum equipment.

4. Pilots using 2.4 GHz Spread Spectrum radios are not required to use a frequency control system.

5. When using the frequency paddle stand, if another pilot is using the frequency paddle, those waiting for the frequency will indicate that by placing their pin on the side of the paddle. If others are waiting for the frequency, possession of the channel shall be limited to fifteen (15) minutes. NOTE: No one shall remove ANOTHER'S pin from the frequency control paddle and REPLACE it with any other pin.

6. The use of an impound area during events will be up to the discretion of the organizers or CD of that event.

So if you have one of those long antennas coming out the top of the transmitter, please make sure to use the Paddles!

I hope to see you all at the field soon!
