#### Vice-President's Message

#### Hi All,

It has been a very busy month and a half as far as pattern contests go. The beginning of May found us at the Apache Junction flying field. We stayed with a friend Mike used to work with, which made it nice. There were 3 of us from our club who made the journey. Robert Fish took 5th in Masters, Mike took 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Advanced class and I took second in Intermediate. The weather was close to 100 and we had a cross wind most of the weekend.

Two weeks later found us in Riverside attending a contest CD'd by Tony. There were several club members there that weekend with most doing quite well. In Sportsman Don F. took first, with Jim W. taking second. In intermediate Jamie S. took first, I was in 4<sup>th</sup> and Mike W. taking 5<sup>th</sup>. In the Advanced class Mike G. took first, in the Masters class Robert F. took second, and being the only one in FAI, Tony F. did a clean sweep.

The end of May found us in Hesperia for the wind fest. On Saturday the winds were blowing 20 to 25 mph and Sunday brought on even more wind 25 to 30. Most classes flew 3 rounds on Saturday and 2 on Sunday. My class however only got in 4 rounds, 2 on Saturday and 2 on Sunday. The top 3 pilots in Intermediate each won a round in the first 3. Jim W. took Sportsman, I took 3<sup>rd</sup> and Mike W. taking 4<sup>th</sup>. Mike G. took 1<sup>st</sup> in Advanced with Robert F. only flying 3 rounds in the Masters class on Saturday and couldn't return on Sunday.

Mike and I had planned a trip to Redmond, Oregon for one of their contests, and decided to take a few extra days and compete at Oakdale where it was hot and another wind fest, 20 to 30 mph. Mike took 3<sup>rd</sup> in his class and I had a decent start than sank to the bottom. Monday morning we headed north, getting to Redmond around 8:30 that night. We camped at their field and it was so nice getting up in the mornings with the wind

NOT blowing 20 to 30 mph. Mike and I were able to get in several practice flights a day. For a very nice facility, not many members showed up to fly, we just about had the place ourselves all week. While we were there I met up with some friends I grew up with, which was great getting caught up and reminiscing about the good old days. Wednesday morning we were awaken at 5:30 am to the sounds of a generator and big fans used to inflate a hot air balloon. There was a crew getting the balloon ready to take people for rides. This happened again on Friday, Saturday and Sunday mornings. The weather was in the low to mid 80's with slight winds (less than 15) which came from all directions, with it getting stronger in the evenings. In Intermediate class I took 1st and Mike Took 1<sup>st</sup> in the Advanced class. We hated leaving after the contest but one of us (not me) has to go back to work.

As far as contests go, we have a break until August, but in the mean time we hope to get in lots of practice. Here's hoping the winds will die down soon. Happy flying....


